



## 2009 - 2010 CONTINUING EDUCATION UNIT AQUATIC WORKSHOPS

Staying on the cutting edge of advances in our field is vital in the operation of aquatic facilities in this day and time. Recognizing this fact, the Iowa Park and Recreation Association is dedicated to providing eleven half-day workshops which address both updated information in addition to your individual questions and concerns. This workshop will break each of these issues down and find methods for avoiding and resolving problems and concerns in your facility. This year's workshops will focus on:

- **FACILITY SAFETY** – every facility can use a safety audit each year while the state or local health department will also inspect your swimming pool and/or spa. This session will discuss how to take steps to make your facility safer as well as point out what the inspectors will be looking for when they arrive.
- **MAINTENANCE SYSTEMS** – the proper up keep of your pumps, motors, heaters, filters, and other equipment which needs maintenance can mean the difference between a stress free season and a frustrating one. This session will discuss developing a comprehensive plan to help maintain your facility.
- **POOL AND SPA WATER PROBLEMS** – does the air in your swimming pool and/or spa have an unpleasant order? Does the water get cloudy in the middle of the afternoon? What is the white stuff that wipes off the side walls? All questions which can haunt any facility operator. This session will address some of the more typical problems out there along with those germane to your facility.

The workshops are based on meeting the needs of the participants. Time will be set aside to address individual questions and concerns. The format is extremely flexible and focuses on “real problems in the real world”. Participants are encouraged to come with questions for our knowledgeable staff to answer.

The workshop will be lead by experts in the swimming pool and spa industry. Our teaching staff includes individuals with up-to-date education in state-of-the-art technology, extensive experience in construction of new and refurbished facilities as well as hands-on experience in all facets of pool operation. Their broad background and ability to relate to class members' questions combine for an outstanding educational experience.

In addition to being an excellent source of information, *this workshop has been approved by the Iowa Department of Public Health for 2.5 hours of continuing education* in accordance with part 641-12.11(2) of the Iowa Health Code which requires all Certified Pool Operators to receive an average of at least two hours of CEU's per year in a five year period concurrent with the individual's CPO certification. This CEU Workshop does not update your Certified Pool Operator license as issued by the National Swimming Pool and Spa Foundation.

The workshop will begin at 1:00 p.m. and end at 4:15 p.m. The fee is \$100.00 for Non-Iowa Park & Recreation Association members and \$90.00 for Iowa Park & Recreation Association members.
